Sitting Down with Ntombifuthi Magwaza Sibiya

One of the highlights of our month was spending time with Ntombifuthi Magwaza Sibiya, one of South Africa's most celebrated telephone-wire artists. If you've ever seen her work, you'll know why. Her bold colours, intricate patterns, and her blend of Zulu and Ndebele influences make each piece instantly recognizable and deeply meaningful.

Ntombifuthi has been weaving since the early 90s and has won 2 FNB Vita Craft Now Awards. Her work is held in major South African Museums, and is currently featured in the iNgqikithi yokuPhica / Weaving meanings exhibition at the Museum of International Folk Art in the U.S.

What stays with you most when you sit with her is not the accolades, it's her heart and presence. Hearing her journey in her own words was inspiring and the full story will be available on our website, a beautiful read for anyone who wants to know the woman behind the work.

Our Sparkling Beaded Snowflake Has Landed at Oceans Mall!

After weeks of dedication and teamwork, our giant beaded snowflake is complete and proudly at Oceans Mall! This project was a true collaboration, but the real stars were our incredible beading ladies. Many learned new techniques—working with crystal beads and an open-weave style—while also earning much-needed income. The snowflake's welded frame was divided into smaller shapes by our wireworkers, which were then beautifully beaded by the crafters. Once complete, Nqobile from our big-art team, together with Paula and several Woza Moya staff, assembled and painted the final structure and added internal lights to bring it to life.

A heartfelt thank-you to the Oceans Mall team for choosing handmade and supporting income generation in our communities. They are delighted with the final piece, which now joins their festive collection alongside the giant baubles and surfing snowman.
